Dear Egg Harbor Township Residents:

The Coronavirus Fall wave has hit the Township in the same fashion as the rest of the country. We had two hundred eighty-seven (287) positive cases in October 2020. The most cases in one month since our first positive case on April 1, 2020. This is greater than the total number of positive cases recorded in July, August and September (249). The highest number of positive tests for a month previously was April with 140 positive cases. In addition, four (4) residents died as a result of the virus. We had no deaths in August or September.

The Township, as of October 31, 2020, has had eight hundred fifty (850) positive cases with twenty-six (26) deaths. Medical experts warned us about a Fall wave and it appears that their forecast, unfortunately, was correct.

As a community, we need to stay vigilant in our social distancing and interactions with others. Continue wearing masks at all times when you are outside your home or car and wash your hands frequently.

Wearing a mask shows respect to your fellow residents that you care about their well-being and the quality of their lives. Putting on a mask should be a habit similar to putting your seatbelt on in a car.
